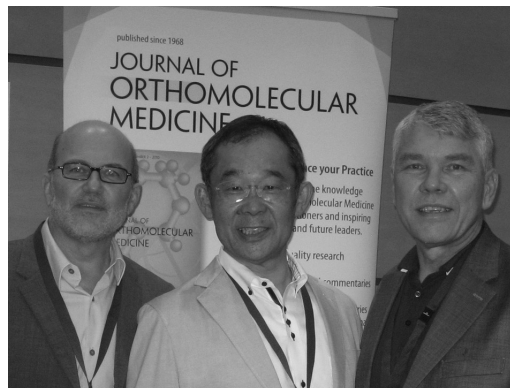


Report on II International Congress: Updates and Advances in Clinical Nutrition and Orthomolecular Medicine Valencia, Spain June 15, 16

Dr. Antonio Marco Chover and the Spanish Society for Organology and Organotherapy hosted 200 delegates at the II Orthomolecular Congress in the beautiful city of Valencia. The comprehensive program presented speakers from Spain, France, the Netherlands, Japan, and the United States. We are pleased to announce that the Japanese College of Intravenous Therapy has officially become an associate member of the International Society for Orthomolecular Medicine. The College, founded in 2007



with Dr. Atsuo Yanagisawa as President, has grown to almost 440 doctors in 432 clinics and hospitals in every region of Japan. In April 2012, the JCIT released the important DVD on the protective effects of intravenous and oral vitamin C on radiation exposure from the Fukushima nuclear plant in March 2011.

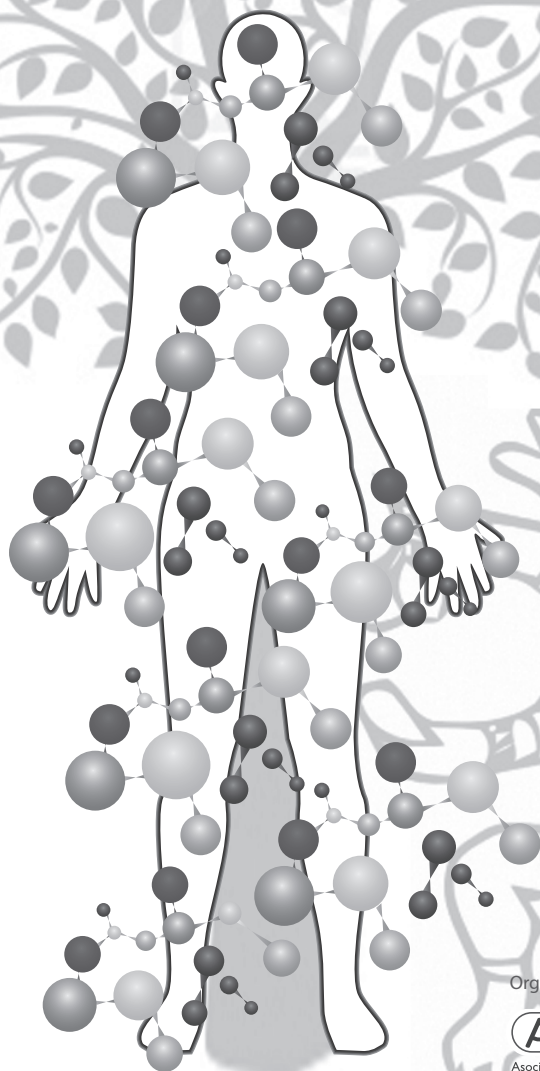

1st Orthomolecular Medicine Conference in Mexico
